
Pain, Power, & Optimism Define **Black American Attitudes**

As we track the attitudes of Black Americans, shifting pain into power continues to define Black political participation, from the 2020 summer of unrest, the recent general election, and now reimagining public safety. Black people continue to say that addressing racism and discrimination should be the number one priority for America's leaders to address. After a year of racial reckoning, Black American attitudes on policing have shifted with now a majority supporting "Defund the Police." Black people are expressing political power in their pain and are more optimistic about their future, expecting their political leaders to make progress on the issues that matter to them the most.


© DEFUND THE POLICE

A majority of Black Americans want to defund the police. Black perceptions have shifted on the slogan, which in previous polls was unfavorable. Furthermore, when defund the police is explained as redirecting police funds to community resources, support grows even higher.

Do you generally agree or disagree that Police Departments should be defunded?




© TOP ISSUE PRIORITIES






⊚ GEORGE FLOYD & CHAUVIN GUILTY VERDICT



The party's most loyal voting bloc strongly approves of the Democrats they elected to the White House and to Congress and feel that Joe Biden is addressing the needs of the Black community.




O A STRUGGLE TO MAKE ENDS MEET

While Black Americans are optimistic about the direction of the country, there are hardships with many struggling to make ends meet.


> 13% of Black adults faced foreclosure or eviction in the last 3 months including:



23% of Black adults were unable to pay their full rent or mortgage in the last 3 months including:





37% of Black adults had to skip a bill in the last 3 months including:




O OPTIMISM & IMPROVEMENT IN QUALITY OF LIFE

BlackTrack not only tracks the opinions of Black Americans but also disaggregates the data into demographic groups to understand Black voters' full diversity. This BlackTrack survey was fielded from May 28 - June 1, 2021, conducted via online, opt-in panel, with a margin of error of +/-3.1% at a 95% confidence level The information above represents selected data from the BlackTrack survey.
